The Role

Oxfam in Myanmar is looking for Monitoring, Evaluation, Accountability and Learning Coordinator.

The purpose of this role is to take specific responsibility for a small portfolio of Humanitarian and Resilience or economic justice projects, ensuring they have effective MEAL systems, working with partners and project managers to collect data, undertake analysis and ensure findings inform project implementation.

Our role will require a range of skills and experience.



Job Responsibilities

- Ensure effective planning and implementation of monitoring, evaluation, accountability and learning for humanitarian, resilience and economic Justice projects together with project managers and partners
- Develop and implement a calendar of MEAL events for a portfolio of projects
- Together with programme staff, lead the design of MEAL frameworks and action plans for humanitarian, resilience and economic Justice projects
- Lead in designing and facilitating an annual programme learning event, and smaller project reviews.
- Design and lead baseline/mid-term/end line, post distribution monitoring (PDM), KAPs and other surveys and internal project evaluations as required
- Perform quantitative data analysis, interpretation, triangulation, visualization, dissemination (graphs), presentation and reporting
- Work with project staff and partners to develop regular monitoring processes including establishing beneficiary databases and required data collection tools.
- Commission external evaluators and other consultants as required
- Conduct regular physical monitoring of the assigned projects
- Perform data quality assessment to verify the quality of reported data of partner organizations for key performance indicators and support data management systems.
- Lead the development and implementation of a mechanism for accountability to beneficiaries.
- Provide MEAL technical support to partners and relevant staff, ensuring MEAL data is translated into clear information that can be used to inform decision making.

Job Requirement

- Minimum of 3 years of working experience in designing and implementation of MEAL in humanitarian, resilience and rights based-development programme
- At least degree level in social sciences, statistics, international development, mathematics, international relations or other relevant fields.
- Demonstrated technical skills in monitoring and evaluation including developing MEAL frameworks, designing and undertaking data collection, analysing quantitative data, and reporting.
- Demonstrated commitment to using documentation and MEAL to learn from programmes, and applying this to improving Oxfam's overall impact.
- Strong technical understanding of quantitative, qualitative and mixed methods
- Strong knowledge of ICT4D and familiarity with associated web-based platforms and applications
- Strong knowledge and application of statistical software is an advantage
- Experience in establishing community feedback mechanisms
- Strong facilitation skills such as workshops/ FGDs and experience in building capacity of varied stakeholders
- Ability to manage multiple priorities, work under pressure and deadlines.
- Ability to communicate and influence effectively with teams and individuals.
- Good written and verbal communication skills in English and Burmese (Jingpaw, Rakhine and/or Basic knowledge of Chinese is an advantage)
- Ability and willingness to undertake extensive travel in the country
- Willingness to work on sensitive programming across conflict areas within Myanmar, including Rakhine and Kachin
- Commitment to Oxfam's overall goals and values, including a strong commitment to gender, diversity, inclusion, capacity building and rights based approaches.
