The Role:

Oxfam is looking for Programme Officer (Right to Food).

Job Purpose:

To contribute to the results of Oxfam's programme work on land and sustainable agriculture, in accomplishing programme goals, objectives and activities effectively and efficiently.

Background:

Oxfam's programme work on land and sustainable agriculture is focused in Kachin and Shan States and builds upon the work of Oxfam's civil society partners to protect the natural resource rights of small-holder farmers in Kachin and Shan – particularly land, forest in the face of inward investment and land grabs. The Programme Officer under the supervision and guidance of Programme Coordinator, RtF will work with the Oxfam and programme partners by carrying out research, and in facilitating implementation of the project.



Job Requirements

- 3 years' experiences of programme work, including planning, monitoring activities, working with project implementing partners and field experience, on projects including livelihoods, forestry and land projects (Desirable).
- University degree in related field (polical science, law, economics, rural development, anthropology etc)
- Experience of working with Myanmar NGOs and Community Based Organizations on land governance and/or community forestry.
- Satisfactory level interpersonal and communications skills.
- Fluency in spoken and written Burmese and English.
- Ability to follow and summarize internal meetings, and external events and meetings, policy discussions (in writing or verbally)

Other:

- Ability to travel to remote areas in the programme area sometimes for extended periods.
- Commitment to an understanding of Oxfam's aims values and principles.
- Understanding of gender, diversity issues and demonstrable commitment to promote gender equality and diversity.
