Relevant fields include: Public Health, Environmental Engineering, Chemistry or another science discipline; a Social Sciences background will also be considered. Relevant experience and proven ability can substitute the need for formal qualifications.

Essential

- Proven management skills and experience
- Computer literate (MS Word & Excel, Internet and E-mail)
- Candidates must be methodical, patient and diligent
- Strong communication, team work, and inter-personal skills.
- Good listening skills.
- Ability to work under pressure, to be flexible in work areas and to be responsive to changing needs.
