KEY RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. Technical

- Assessments participate in new assessments and surveys as needed aiming at producing quantitative and qualitative data using different techniques such as transect walks, FDGs, key informants interview and PDM.
- Contribute to Public Health promotion and community engagement activities design and planning.
- Contribute to the implement field level Public Health promotion and community engagement activities together with camp based staff and volunteers.
- Contribute to design and manage periodic studies to monitor and measure progress and the health impact of the WASH intervention
- Capacity building as an Officer you will be expected to support and coach the Community engagement facilitators and volunteers.
- Emergency response participate in public health response to emergencies such as disease outbreaks or flooding

2. Co-ordination

- Co-ordinate at camp levels workplans with the Public Health Engineer team lead by SI, attending joint meetings and assessments as needed
- Ensure beneficiaries are consulted and involved in programme design; in particular, working closely with Camp Management Committees (CMCs) and other community groups
- Co-ordinate activities with other NGOs working in the project target areas in WASH, camp management, education and other sectors.

Management

- Lead the team of camp based community facilitators and volunteers.
- Prepare weekly and monthly workplans in collaboration with other members of the PHP team.
- Participate in weekly team meetings to review and plan work, and prepare reports as requested by the PHE Co-ordinator.
- Work closely with logistics team in procurement and stock management, ensuring that materials are procured in sufficient time and to the necessary standard/ quality.
- Liaise with finance/ HR/ admin officer to ensure that Oxfam procedures are strictly followed.

SKILLS AND COMPETENCE:

- A post-secondary training in social science or public health.
- Minimum of 2 years of NGO work (preferably post-emergency and recovery phases), with practical experience in community mobilization, Public Health Promotion and community engagement.
- Experience of participatory approaches and tools, field assessments and monitoring, community development, public health and community engagement projects.
- Knowledge of WASH in emergency response and experience in applying Sphere standards; understanding of humanitarian principles and ways-of-working.
- Knowledge of Hygiene promotion approaches such as PHAST, CLTS, WASH in school and community action planning.
- Diplomacy, initiative, communication and interpersonal skills, together with the capacity to remain calm under pressure and not lose sight of priorities.
- Sensitivity to cultural differences and an in depth understanding of Myanmar culture and practices. Committed to Equal Opportunities (e.g. race, ethnicity, religion, disability)
- A thorough understanding and commitment towards gender equity issues and accountability in recovery / development work.
