### **Rationale**

According to Vietnam General Statistic Office and UN Fund for Sustainable Development (2012), during 2000-2010, Vietnamese women spend average 2.3 hours per day to do housework compare with 1.5 hours of men. The result of Vietnam Women Union (VWU) research in 2015 about unpaid work of women in rural show that, these numbers were 4.4 hours for the wife compared to 2.0 hours of the husband. Even worse, women with children under 6 still spend more than 50 hours per month just on childcare (ActionAid, 2018). The impact that unequal distribution of unpaid care results to no real free time for women. The traditional thinking of unpaid care work is for women and do not have economic importance still prevail in society. These underestimates the ability and the status of the women not only in their family but also in the community. Understanding of the importance of women's unpaid work and its value with specific figures will serve as hard evidence input in improving the



contribution of women to the economy. Hopefully, with the result from this project, the public awareness of unpaid work (which mainly done by women) will be increased and it will attract the government's attention to the importance of gender equality and contribute further towards formulating national policy on women, employment, care of children and the elderly, and other related issues.

### **The Role**

Oxfam in Vietnam is seeking for consultant service to conduct a pilot project to quantify the value of domestic work in Vietnam basing on scientific methodology.

# Scope of work for consultancy service

This consultancy service provider, with its professional facilitating skills, is expected to:

- Develop a proposal on measurable methodology of unpaid care work and its value scientifically, trustworthy and suitable to Vietnam context;
- Conducting the actual survey in Vietnam context with identified methods
- Providing a result report on the monetary value of unpaid care work
- Sharing the result of the survey with related stakeholders

### **Deliverables of the Consultancy Service**

- Measurable methodology of unpaid care work and its value in Vietnam context
- Survey report
